HOSPITAL PROFILE

Rex Healthcare

Raleigh, NC 27607

Rex Healthcare was founded in 1894 and is a private-not-for-profit hospital located in Raleigh, NC. The 394-bed facility offers progressive yet personal healthcare services through comprehensive inpatient and outpatient care. Although Rex Hospital has occupied its current site at the corner of Lake Boone Trail and Blue Ridge Road since 1980, the Rex Cancer Center officially opened September 13, 1987. Rex has long been the number one choice for those in Wake County who have been diagnosed with cancer.

Rex Cancer Registry has a staff of 4 full-time and 2 casual-time registrars, and all six have achieved their CTR credentials. Our software is OncoLog. Rex Cancer Program is approved by the American College of Surgeons (ACoS) as a Community Hospital Comprehensive Cancer Program. Our last ACoS survey was in May 2002 resulting in a 3-year approval with an excellent review and no contingencies. Our next survey will be in May 2005.

The registry accessioned 1759 cases last year bringing the total number of cases in the database to over 31,000 since our reference date of 1988. Our Cancer Registry staff consists of:


