

Message from the President: Elizabeth Tucker, CTR

When Adaline told me it was time for a newsletter, I felt overwhelmed. I could not imagine what I could write about that would be worth reading. I had a budget to prepare and finish the SAR and prepare for the survey! But, when I put the SAR in the mail on Tuesday, I knew exactly what I should write about!!

What can I share about the SAR?

If your survey is in two years—begin now!

Print the SAR Application Training Guide-Read it as if you were studying for the Certification exam. There is information in that guide that is not found in other documents-or at least I had not seen in print.

Read the COC Flash faithfully!

You can put in data, leave the application and come back to work on it later. Just remember to use the save button every time you see one. Always save the page. You can go back in and edit anything. PROOF! PROOF!

Complete all requested information. One screen in particular asked when we had completed work on our goal. We had not completed it, so I left it blank. I called Vicki at ACoS, she told me to put in a <u>future</u> date. The wording said HAD not will be, but it worked.

When you work on the SAR there is the Standard listed at the top with the sub standards listed in turquoise. While you are working on them they turn purple. Sometimes they do not change back to turquoise. I thought those in purple had an error---oh no, the color means nothing. Also, at the bottom is a listing of chapters that are incomplete. Do not pay attention to color here either. Just that they are incomplete. The only color you need to be concerned about is in the menu along the LEFT side, the color is gold when all your answers have been entered correctly.

I would also suggest that when you enter the data on Standard 3.4 and 3.5 (Follow-up information) enter that the day you mail out your application.

Duke University Hospital (Part of Duke University Hospital System) Erwin Road Durham, NC 27710

"The Future of Medicine, Delivered Today"

Duke University Hospital (DUH) is a 924 bed hospital founded in 1930 (along with the Duke University Medical School). In July we'll be celebrating our 75th Anniversary. **Oncology statistics:** 7600 inpatients per year, 120,000 outpatient visits per year with 30% of our patients coming from outside North Carolina.

In 1973, the Duke Cancer Center was designated a "comprehensive" cancer center by the NCI—we are now one of 61 comprehensive cancer centers nationwide. At Duke, there is a theme that permeates the atmosphere – *"At Duke, there is Hope"*. We do not abandon any patient or family in their struggle against cancer, no matter what the situation may be. Duke oncologist Dr. Joseph Moore recently said, "I truly believe there's no one whom I can't help somehow. I may not be able to cure them, but I can relieve some of their symptoms, or ease their anxieties just by being available and letting them know I'm truly interested in their well-being." This is our commitment to every cancer patient at Duke. Basic research is performed at Duke and much of that research "translates" into new diagnostic tools and treatment modalities. (Duke Researchers developed the test for Ca-125 and identified the BRCA1 breast cancer gene.) We currently have over 250 clinical trials open for cancer patients. Prevention and early detection trials are also offered.

We have the full array of cancer services including minimally-invasive surgical techniques, radiation therapy, all types of systemic therapy including Targeted therapies and Adult & Pediatric Bone Marrow Transplants. We are also very proud of the Brain Tumor Center which is researching new systemic treatments for malignant and benign brain tumors.

Affiliated with Duke University Hospital through the Duke University Health System (DUHS) are Durham Regional Hospital (DRH) and Duke Health Raleigh Hospital (DHRH)--formerly Raleigh Community Hospital. In addition, the Duke Oncology Network reaches out to provide clinical and oncology management services to nine affiliate hospitals in North Carolina & Virginia. (DHRH, Durham VA, Granville Medical Center, Johnston Memorial Hospital, Maria Parham Medical Center, Memorial Hospital of Martinsville & Henry County, Person Memorial Hospital, Scotland Memorial Hospital and Southeast Regional Medical Center.)

The Cancer Registry was originally started in about 1938 as a *surgical* follow up registry. We currently use the IMPAC-MRS cancer data system which includes data for all three DUHS hospitals (DUH, DRH and DHRH) in our multi-hospital database. The Duke database currently has over 109,000 cases going back to 1970. Since our current reference date of 1990, we have 64,000 cases. We add approximately 4900 new cases (including non-analytic) per year and are actively following 27,000 analytic cases. [NOTE: Follow Up requests for patients seen at Durham Regional or Duke Health Raleigh should be sent directly to those registries.]

A unique feature of our registry is electronic case finding. We receive all potential reportable cases (and demographics) through the following electronic interfaces: Pathology (using SNOMED morphology codes for neoplasms), Inpatient coding (using ICD9 codes), Outpatient coding for OP surgeries (using ICD9 codes) and Clinic cases from IDX coding (using both ICD9 codes, select CPT codes and the most likely clinics where patients would be managed for cancer/reportable neoplasms). The only manual case finding is for Autopsies, which we hope to automate in the near future. We save a lot of paper using

electronic interfaces (4-5 inches of path reports per day in the past) and we save time not having to enter demographic information on new cases. "Case screening" still has to be done to eliminate non-reportable

cases and follow up cases before we start to abstract. (Out of approximately 18,000 suspense records loaded, we only abstract about 4900 new cases per year.)

We find it both interesting and challenging to encounter and learn about rare & unusual cancers and cutting-edge treatment modalities. We wish that ICDO would be updated a little more frequently to keep up with changing terminology and new ways to classify neoplasms!

SEER RX DRUG DATABASE SOFTWARE NOW AVAILABLE

The SEER Rx program became available to registrars July 1, 2005 and is available at no charge. It can be downloaded at <u>http://www.seer.cancer.gov/seerrx</u>. You will need to register your name, e-mail address and institution. This will allow you to obtain a password that is required to download the program to your desktop and you will not need internet access to open up the program once it is downloaded. Your e-mail address will be used to keep you informed of when updates are available, which will about every six months. This program gives you access to over 1600 drugs and over 700 regimens and how they should be coded.

Some drugs have changed categories beginning with cases diagnosed in 2005. (Per an e-mail from April Fritz to Adaline Brown dated 7/12/2005) "The following drugs in the 5/17/02 Book 8 update have changed from immunotherapy to cytostatic chemotherapy in SEER Rx:

Alemtuzumab/Campath Bexarolene/Targretin Bevacizumab/Avastin Bortezomib/Velcade Pegaspargase/Oncaspar Rituximab/Rituxan Trastuzumab/Herceptin Asparaginase

"The following drugs originally may have been coded as monoclonal antibodies but are radioisotopes in SEER Rx:

Epratuzumab/LymphoCide Ibrituzumab tiuxetan/Zevalin Tositumomab/Bexxar
