Triad Partnership Meeting of the American Cancer Society & American College of Surgeons Atlanta, Georgia - July 12-13,2000

What is the Southeastern TRIAD?

Several years ago, the Commission on Cancer established the Triad Clinical Cancer Control Program. The goal of the program was to expand cancer control efforts at the Division level by partnering and collaborating with state level groups and individuals involved in cancer control. With the recent formation of the Southeast Division, (NC, SC, & GA.) the opportunity now exists to expand the Triad Clinical Cancer Control Program. The major goal of the workshop was to develop a collaborative effort that will enhance cancer control activities at the community level by foregoing strong, productive relationships between organization represented down to the grassroots level. I was invited to attend as a representative from ANCCR, and also in attendance was the presidents' of SC and GA's Cancer Registrars. I will list some of the ideas that came out of the meeting.

- 1 Begin to introduce the TRIAD concept to various organizations.
- 2. Pull together all three-state plans and look for areas of overlap that are a priority for all three states.
- 3. Ensure ACOS representation in the plan.
- 4. Create a combined calendar of events, relevant to meetings, training, conferences, etc. as a means to increase communication, decrease duplication and capitalize upon resources to further all of our work.
- 5. Sponsor a symposium in 2001.

Specific Action Steps- for the Cancer Registrars:

- Educating/alleviating fears about confidentiality
- Encourage local education of physicians/hospitals on better documentation on medical record
- State Cancer Registries targeting education for hospital registrars to improve quality
- Invite registry staff to annual state ACOS Liaison Meetings
- State and local level advocacy -funding, law enforcement, importance of CTR's
- Financial support for annual meetings and scholarships for training
 - Generate ideas and research questions for the TRIAD.

These are just some of ideas generated from the meeting. You will be hearing more from different areas at the Fall Meeting and articles in *The Sentinel* by Dr. Peter Turk.

The meeting has been called a success and has provided a platform in which many could share their ideas with other counterparts as the NC, SC & GA TRIAD.
